

Jean-Philippe Demeyer: a celebration of imagination and audacity


Jean-Philippe Demeyer


Ann Leda Shapiro. Portals of Healing and Resistance

Portals of Healing and Resistance is the first comprehensive monograph on the American artist Ann Leda Shapiro, whose visually arresting and symbolically layered works have challenged cultural taboos and institutional limits for over five decades. Shapiro works primarily in watercolor and drawing, developing delicate yet powerful works on paper that often incorporate symbolic and organic elements.

Edited by Christina Yuen Zi Chung and Catharina Manchanda, the book offers new feminist and decolonial readings of Shapiro's work. It includes an in-depth conversation with artist Joyce Kozloff, as well as over 150 pages of full-color reproductions and archival materials. This publication is an essential contribution to feminist art history and a long-overdue recognition of a visionary artist whose work continues to resonate across generations and geographies.



Magali Reus. 27


27 features 27 recent works from two series titled *Clementine* and *Merlin* (2023–24) by London-based artist Magali Reus (NL, b.1981). This book, in its beautifully crafted materiality, format and typography, mimics a diary or romantic novel.

Both series of works are documented in the style of portraiture photography and carefully categorised alongside a numerical font re-constructed by Reus from her grandmother's handwriting.

Additionally, newly commissioned writing by the celebrated American writer Danielle Dutton responds to the series, and is featured alongside selections from the artist's own archive of photographic imagery. It will also feature a visual collection of research and process material directly from Reus' studio.

Over deze auteur(s):

Magali Reus (b. 1981, The Hague) is a Dutch artist known for her meticulously constructed sculptural works that explore the language of objects and systems of control. Through a precise, often industrial aesthetic, she reconfigures everyday forms such as lockers, fridges, and road signs into layered compositions that challenge utility, desire, and the boundaries between the organic and the manufactured.



Magali Reus. Our Volumes



Our Volumes is a comprehensive catalogue based on a recent mid-career retrospective of the London-based Dutch artist Magali Reus (b.1981) at the Museum Kurhaus Kleve, Germany (2024).

Structured around seven chapters, the book chronicles or ‘volumes’ by employing an archival aesthetic. It features a highly insightful and elaborate newly commissioned essay by Evan Moffitt on Reus’ work at Museum Kurhaus Kleve.

In addition to expansive exhibition views, the book engages in dialogue with photographic imagery drawn from the Museum Kurhaus Kleve’s noted historical collection. This includes items such as ancient religious woodcarvings, ornate silverware and artist Ewald Mataré’s (1887-1965, GER) sculpture, which can be found contrastingly paired alongside the artist’s careful selection of over a hundred works spanning a period of two decades.



Paul Felix 1913 - 1981

Marc Felix

- Paul Felix was een invloedrijke, maar ondergewaardeerde architect die het Belgisch modernisme vormgaf
- Het boek belicht Felix’ belangrijkste werken, zoals de school in Slijpe en de Sint-Jozefkerk in Oostende
- Geschreven door zijn zoon, biedt het boek een intieme kijk op de erfenis van Paul Felix

Paul Felix: 1913–1981 is de monografie over één van België’s meest invloedrijke maar ondergewaardeerde modernistische architecten. Dit rijk geillustreerde boek vormt de meest recente en uitgebreide verkenning van Felix’ baanbrekende werk, en biedt een intieme blik op zijn architecturale visie die het Belgisch modernisme heeft gevormd.

Geschreven door Marc Felix, de zoon van de architect, bevat het boek een boeiend essay dat ingaat op de persoonlijke en professionele erfenis van Paul Felix, en werpt nieuw licht op zijn ontwerpen en hun blijvende betekenis. Met een verbluffende collectie beelden en doordachte analyses is dit boek een essentiële aanvulling voor de bibliotheek van elke architectuur liefhebber en een onmisbaar werk voor wie gepassioneerd is door modernistische architectuur.

Hoewel Paul Felix enigszins over het hoofd werd gezien door het grote publiek, blijft zijn werk resoneren binnen de wereld van de modernistische architectuur. Deze monografie biedt een frisse blik op zijn bijdrage, en helpt zijn belangrijke nalatenschap opnieuw onder de aandacht te brengen bij een nieuwe generatie architecten en liefhebbers.



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
